HBCU Firsts in Sports



2022 has been a year of historical firsts for HBCU sports. Schools have begun first-ever sports programs, won first-ever championships, and broken winning records. Check out some of the HBCU sports programs that are making history!

Fisk University launched the first HBCU intercollegiate women's artistic gymnastic team.

Morgan State University becomes the first HBCU Division I program to offer acrobatics and tumbling (beginning 2023-2024).

Xavier University's Cheer Team won its first-ever NAIA National Team Championship. The team won this coveted award after only three years of competing. The record-setting final score was 93.70 out of a possible 100 points.

Saint Augustine's University launched the first HBCU women's rowing team. The team has recently been approved and registered by the American Collegiate Rowing Association (ACRA). It plans to compete against other schools in local regattas in the coming months.

Fort Valley State University, Kentucky State University, Morehouse College, Paine College, and Benedict College all began their historic first season of men's volleyball. Each of the schools received a donation from First Point Volleyball and USA Volleyball to support the launch of their new teams.

Benedict College's Head baseball coach, Selwyn Young recently recorded his 250th career win. On April 14, 2022, he became the all-time winningest coach in program history, with his 250 wins coming in a doubleheader sweep in game two with an 18-1 win over Morris College.

Morehouse College Wins First Prize at 33rd Honda Campus All-Star Challenge



Morehouse College, the nation's only college dedicated to educating and developing men of color, emerged as the national champions of the 33rd Honda Campus All-Star Challenge (HCASC), an academic competition for HBCUs and one of Honda's largest and longest-running philanthropic initiatives in the United States. The final round win against Kentucky State University earned Morehouse the top prize of a \$75,000 institutional grant. In this year's challenge, the Morehouse team bested more than 300 students representing 64 HBCUs from across the country, bringing the college's total HCASC championship titles to five since first competing in 1990. Since 1989, Morehouse College has qualified for the HCASC National Championship Tournament every year.

"Men of Morehouse continue to boldly, bravely, and unapologetically demonstrate the competence and confidence men of color bring to the pursuit of intellectual excellence," said Dr. David A. Thomas, Morehouse College president. "This win continues to prove what Morehouse has long stood for — young Black men who are both nurtured and challenged to reach the highest of expectations can compete with anyone on any global stage."

The four-student Morehouse team demonstrated exceptional skills and teamwork during the fast-paced gameplay, answering questions ranging from history and science to literature and pop culture. Coached for the eighth consecutive year by Robert Myrick '13, the championship team includes team captain Stephen Agyepong '22, Andre Brown '23, Isaiah Thompson '22, and Kendall Wood '23.

Hampton University to Erase Outstanding Student Balances for the Spring 2022 Semester

Recognizing that many Hampton University students and their families have continued to experience financial hardships and have suffered due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Dr. William R. Harvey, Hampton University President, has announced there will be no increase in tuition, fees, room and board for the 2022-2023 academic year. In addition, all outstanding student account balances for the Spring 2022 semester will be erased.

"In keeping with the University's efforts to help our students, there will be no increase in tuition, fees, room and board for the 2022-2023 academic year," said Dr. Harvey. "In addition, on behalf of the University, I am pleased to announce that all outstanding balances for the Spring 2022 semester will be erased. We hope that this Action will continue to assist our students and their families at our Home by the Sea."

This is the latest example of Hampton University assisting its student body financially in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Qualified students received distributions under the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund, and those who had an outstanding balance at the completion of the Spring 2021 semester had their balances paid off. The University also issued a \$200.00 book scholarship to all enrolled students for the Spring 2022 semester. In April of 2020, Dr. and Mrs. Harvey made a \$100,000 matching donation of their own money to a \$100,000 gift from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation to provide each on-campus student with \$100 to assist with travel costs to retrieve their belongings from campus or to return to school in the fall.

2022 ReTool Your School Winners

Introducing “The Beginning”: Fisk University Welcomes First-Ever Modeling Organization

The grounds of Fisk University host many opportunities to be involved, engaged, and active on campus. The institution currently operates with over 30 student-based clubs, organizations, and groups. One of Fisk’s latest initiatives in this area is the recent implementation of a fashion organization.

The Beginning Modeling Organization (or The Beginning), a student organization on campus, unites different types of fashion-oriented students. The first student engagement organization of its kind on Fisk grounds ever, The Beginning was founded in 2021 by senior Genesis Williams. She’s possessed a sense of fashion since her adolescent years. “I consider myself a wacky lady, so when I observe people on campus I am personally looking for like-minded creatives.” she said during the interview. The idea for this project came to Williams after realizing the university did not offer a fashion-related major. So far, The Beginning is focused on building portfolios for its members and “creating a fashion presence” in the local community.

After their debut in the fall of 2021, the Beginning Modeling Organization enjoyed great success. The organization earned a special showing on a popular Instagram page dedicated to highlighting Historically Black Colleges & University fashion culture — HBCU drip, hosted an educational 5-day week of knowledgeable sessions, executed the first-ever flash mob on campus in Fisk’s cafeteria, and implemented community service work such as a clothing drive, environmental cleanups and more.
